Re: Paratherm NF - Heat Transfer Fluid

This is in reply to your letters of April 23 and June 29, 1992 concerning the proposed use of the subject product in food processing establishments.

Based on the information presently available, we would have no objection to the composition and intended use of this product as a heat transfer fluid provided that:

- a) the product is used in closed heat transfer systems where there will be no contact with food
- b) the product is only used in the minimum amount required to achieve the technical effect
- c) its use in food machinery is technically suitable and will not result in direct or indirect contamination of foods

We would also have no objection to the use of this product as a lubricant in food plants provided that:

- a) it is used on equipment or machine parts where contact with food is only incidental
- b) it is only used in the minimum amount required to achieve the technical effect

Should this product be used as an antirust film on the equipment, it must be effectively washed or otherwise removed from the surfaces prior to re-use of the equipment.

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
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We would request that a copy of the label for the product indicating its use in food plants be furnished for the records of our file.
